I am an Administrative Law Judge with the Office of Hearings and Mediation Services of the New York State Department of Environmental Conservation. I am joined by my colleague, David Greenwood.

Judge Greenwood and I have been assigned to conduct this evening's public comment hearing. Applicant, Route 13 Rocks, LLC, operates the Cortlandville Sand and Gravel Mine, and has applied to the New York State Department of Environmental Conservation to modify its current mined land use plan, and related mined land reclamation permit.

Department staff, as the lead agency, pursuant to the State Environmental Quality Review Act, identified the proposed modification as a Type I Action, issued a positive declaration on May 12, 2021, and required applicant to prepare a draft

This evening I 4 will be giving you a brief overview of 5 Cortlandville Sand and Gravel's DEIS on behalf of the Applicant, Route 13 Rocks, 6 LLC. 7 We will be touching on the permit 8 9 history, giving a site overview, review 10 the current permit conditions as well as 11 any proposed modifications, and, 12 finally, review the technical studies 13 that have been completed to date and a 14 brief conclusions of those studies. 15 So for permit history, the original 16 technical studies were conducted in 17 2018, along with the initial application 18 submitted in 2018, between 2018 and Applicant and DEC addressed notes 19 2021. 20 to complete application. Later that year, in 2021, the 21 22 Applicant received a notice of complete, 23 followed by a negative declaration. Later that year, in 2021, DEC 24 25 rescinded the notice of complete

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application requiring the draft

Environmental Impact Statement, which

bring us to 2024 with the submission of

the draft Environmental Impact

Statement.

Site overview. This is Figure 1 from the DEIS. This is a site map. We have the life of mine boundary for Cortlandville Sand and Gravel shown in red here. The property boundary of the Lime Hollow Nature Center shown to the west. Route 13 running here. And Lime Hollow Road running here, with Cortlandville to the northeast. The Lime Hollow wells are located right in this area here.

Current lot permit conditions and the proposed modifications and the image here is the proposed mine plan map.

Mine plan map shows the location of the Lime Hollow pumping wells. Applicant's property boundary is shown here. The current life of mine boundary is denoted by the solid red line. The total is

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66.8 acres.

We have the proposed lateral modification boundary shown to the southeast here by the red dashed

modification boundary shown to the southeast here by the red dashed line. That is a 10.1 acre lateral expansion, with a .4-acre reduction life of mine boundary in the northwest corner here, totalling an acreage of 76.5 acres for the modification.

Next, the current permit conditions and proposed modifications. The image here is the proposed reclamation plan from the DEIS. The current vertical permit conditions allow the extraction of reserves to within eight feet of the groundwater table, approximate elevation 1172.

The proposed vertical modification will allow the extraction material to elevation 1070 approximately 100 feet into the water table.

Technical studies that have been completed to date. A total of nine technical studies have been completed
